#### 1 INTRODUCTION

Maxwell Ventures (Management) Pty Ltd (Maxwell), a wholly owned subsidiary of Malabar Resources Limited (Malabar) owns and operates the Maxwell Underground Mine (the site). The site is in the Upper Hunter Valley of New South Wales (NSW), east-southeast of Denman and south-southwest of Muswellbrook. The site is approved to extract a maximum of 8 million tonnes of run-of-mine coal per year over a period of 26 years.

The site consists of the following areas:

- Underground area comprising the area of underground mining operations and the mine entry area (MEA) to support underground mining and coal handling activities and provide for personnel and materials access;
- Maxwell Infrastructure (formerly Drayton mine) comprising previous open cut mining areas, coal handling and preparation plant (CHPP), train load-out facilities and rail loop, Antiene rail spur and other infrastructure and services; and
- Transport and services corridor between the MEA and Maxwell Infrastructure comprising the site access road, an overland conveyor (to be constructed), power supply and other ancillary infrastructure and services.

Construction of the Maxwell Underground Mine commenced in May 2022. First workings commenced in the Whynot Seam in March 2023 and first coal was produced from the bord and pillar operation at the end of March 2023.

This annual compliance report has been prepared to address Condition 17 of EPBC Approval 2018/8287 (as varied) issued under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Cth) held by Maxwell.
