




7. Exploration Licence Update

Spur Hill (EL7429) Exploration


- Exploration for 2024 includes:
 - Four 2D seismic lines, &
 - Non-core drill holes
- Landholder liaison has occurred for all properties.
- "Ground truthing" has been undertaken and the seismic line locations adjusted accordingly.
- Final locations to be determined in August with archaeology and flora/fauna surveys to occur soon after.





EL9497 and EL9498 Exploration

- Exploration for 2024 includes:
 - Three 2D seismic lines across both Els, &
 - Non-core drill holes
- All activities to occur on Malabar owned land.
- Lessee liaison has occurred.
- Due to wet weather, soft ground conditions have restricted access.
- Ground truthing, archaeology and flora/fauna surveys are planned for late August – early September.












Workforce Snapshot - Residency






Workforce Snapshot – Gender



9. Management Plans and Environmental Performance

Management Plan Updates

- Whynot Seam Extraction Plan Panels 2 5
 - Consultation with Government Agencies and Registered Aboriginal Parties has wrapped up.
 - Feedback is currently being addressed.
 - The Extraction Plan and associated sub-plans have been submitted to DPHI

- Woodlands Hill Seam Extraction Plan Panels 1-4
 - Plan development with technical specialists has commenced.



Rehabilitation Update

Weed Control:

- Cut and paint Golden Wreath Wattle in North Tip and Southern Void area.
- Prickly Pear targeted in East Tip.

Pest Control:

- 1080 wild dog and fox baiting completed June.
- Ongoing pig trapping in Southern Offset Area, 12 pigs trapped in July.

Revegetation:


- Ground preparation for spring 2024 planting commenced.
- Remedial work:
 - Cleaning of contour drains reporting to Southern Void area.
 - Salvage hard rock for rock structure remediation.






PM₁₀ at TEOM-1 (Maxwell Infrastructure)


Missing data 10&11 June due to frozen TEOM requiring a restart. Notified to DPIE via the Major Projects Portal.







PM_{2.5} at TEOM-1 (Maxwell Infrastructure)




The graph shows 24-hour average and long term (rolling annual average) $PM_{2.5}$ concentrations recorded during the reporting period as measured using a TEOM. All were significantly below the 24-hour and annual impact assessment criteria.



PM₁₀ at TEOM-2 (Plashett)


17–20 May 2024: Frozen device, requiring a restart. Notified to DPIE via the Major Projects Portal. 27–28 June 2024: Annual calibration and flow test requiring a zero filter to be applied 24 hours later. 27 July 2024: Scheduled replacement of TEOM due to low flows in the bypass air (non-critical issue)



The graph shows 24-hour average and long term (rolling annual average) PM₁₀ concentrations recorded during the reporting period. All were significantly below the 24-hour and annual impact assessment criteria.



PM_{2.5} at TEOM-2 (Plashett)



The graph shows 24-hour average and long term (rolling annual average) PM_{2.5} concentrations recorded during the reporting period. All were significantly below the 24-hour and annual impact assessment criteria. Small negative values in the range are a function of the TEOM instrument at very low concentrations.

Complaints

No complaints received.



- Muswellbrook Ambulance Station Malabar donated 50 Malabears to be given out to children in a distressing environment to help comfort them.
- Blackroo Community Haven After attending the opening of the new building, we heard there was a need for kids pjs and underwear. Malabar donated over 30 new pairs of pj's and 20 packs of underwear.
- Scone Grammar School Malabar donated \$500 towards their annual school fete & markets









- Harry Scowen Talented local year 12 student from Muswellbrook High School, has been chosen to represent NSW All Schools to play Cricket in Mackay this month. Malabar donated \$500 to help cover some of his out-of-pocket expenses.
- Upper Hunter Markets Local community markets that are held 4th Sunday of every month. Malabar donated \$550 to cover the cost for new signage.
- Singleton Neighbourhood Centre Were in need of donations for the cooler months. Malabar donated \$600 worth of bedding, including sheets, blankets, quilts and quilt covers.









- Denman Public School Some talented year 5 and 6 students participated in Starstruck. Malabar covered the entire participation fee and gifted each student with a Malabar merch pack.
- Scone Neighbourhood Resource Centre Made In Scone Café was in need for a new dishwasher to meet health guidelines. Malabar donated \$3000 to cover the cost for their new industrial dishwasher.
- Muswellbrook Animal Shelter In honour of National Desexing month in July, Malabar donated \$250 worth of toys for the cats and dogs at the shelter.









- Open Door @ Singleton Neighbourhood Centre Malabar funded a NAIDOC morning tea and a 3 course dinner for local community members to come together. This saw over 100 locals come through the door over the 2 day celebrations.
- Wanaruah Local Aboriginal Land Council Malabar donated \$1000 towards the NAIDOC Awards night to honour the incredible achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People in all areas of our society including education, arts, industry, community, sport and youth.
- Sandy Hollow Public School In July, Malabar sponsored a great NAIDOC celebration which also included students from Martindale, Ellerston and Cassilis Public Schools. Uncle Richie Lawton from Budbudda Dreaming shared his talents with the students.









Substantial payments to the Muswellbrook Community

- As with all landowners in Muswellbrook, Malabar pays rates.
- Malabar also makes substantial contributions via the Maxwell Voluntary Planning Agreement.
- As a result, Malabar provides the following annual payments & benefits to the Muswellbrook Community;

VPA

- \$22,275 to contribution to the cost of the council's environmental officers.
- \$111,378 increasing to more than \$500,000 per year as the longwall ramps up,
- Engaging 4 apprentices per year
- The value of the VPA to the Muswellbrook Shire will exceed \$10 million.

Council rates

 Maxwell rates have increased by 500% from \$350,000 in 2017 when Anglo will operating the Drayton Open Cut to \$1,650,000.

Total payments to Muswellbrook Shire

- Hence when the longwall is operating Maxwell is likely to be contributing in excess of \$2million per year to the council
- Although the impact of underground mines are considerably less than open cut mines, the 'ad-valorem' rate for underground mines is now greater than open cuts..... We find this curious
