## Singleton Neighbourhood Centre to offer home learning relief after donation from Malabar Resources

School students in Singleton were set to receive a welcome surprise this week in the form of school, arts and crafts supplies thanks to a donation by local resources company, Malabar Resources.



Malabar donated the school supplies to the Singleton Neighbourhood Centre, a not-for-profit organisation providing support, emergency relief and financial assistance to those in the local area.

The Singleton Neighbourhood Centre will distribute the supplies, including crayons, pencils, workbooks, colouring-in books and art activities to roughly 20 families in need, who are currently learning at home due to the NSW lockdown.

Sue George, President of the Singleton Neighbourhood Centre, said the donation would be greatly appreciated by parents and students having to navigate at home learning.

The Singleton Neighbourhood Centre is located at 21 Mary Street in Singleton and remains open to the community, who can access assistance with food, hygiene packs, power bills and other support.
